Dr Kevin N. Cawley joined the UCC School of Asian Studies in September 2011 as the Director of the Irish Institute of Korean Studies. He is the first lecturer in Korean Studies ever on the entire island of Ireland and has been very active promoting Korean Studies in Ireland in general, and in UCC in particular. He is also the founding and managing editor of the Irish Journal of Asian Studies. Originally from Co. Armagh in Ireland, he completed his undergraduate degree at Trinity College Dublin in French and Irish. He has lived in Korea for several years, and obtained a Masters (with distinction) and PhD in Korean Studies from the School of East Asian Studies (SEAS) at the University of Sheffield, where his dissertation was supervised by the renowned Koreanist, Professor James Huntley Grayson, author of Korea - A Religious History. During his time in Sheffield he also worked as an interpreter for North Korean refugees. He has been the recipient of several prestigious awards, including the Korea Foundation Fellowship and the British Association for Korean Studies (BAKS) Scholarship. He lectures in Korean Religious and Philosophical Traditions, as well as Korean Contemporary Society and Korean History.
